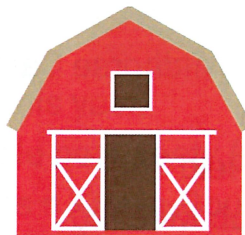

## Kiowa County Market Wheat Show



The Kiowa County Extension Office and Fair Board will host the Market Wheat Show at the Kiowa County Fair. Samples will be collected from trucks at the scale, following the same procedure as previous years.

Participating elevators: Alliance Ag & Grain (Greensburg, HaviLand, Mullinville) and Scoular Grain.

Samples must include the producer's name, phone number, and wheat variety and be submitted by **July 2<sup>nd</sup>**. Late entries will not be accepted. All samples will be graded by the Kansas Grain Inspection Service and displayed at the fair.

### Rules:

- Wheat must be grown in Kiowa County this year.
- Submit one 5-pound, combine-run sample per variety (no hand-picked or screened grain).
- Producers must be recognized by FSA as a Kiowa County tenant.

**Awards:** Ribbons by class, plus premiums for Grand Champion, Reserve Champion, and Top Blue Overall. Ties will split premiums.

### Entries classes:

- Class #1 - Hard White Varieties
- Class #2 - HRW Blends
- Class #3 - Other Commercial Varieties & Hybrids
- Class #4 - Westbred/Monsanto HRW Varieties
- Class #5 - KSU HRW Varieties
- Class #6 - Other Public Varieties

### Sample judging criteria:

Protein .....	225 points
Test Weight .....	200 points
Dockage .....	200 points
Shrunken & Broken .....	100 points
Crop Data Card .....	25 points
Total possible .....	750 points
